MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

A new path for CSHP 2018-2019



This year, a theme of change prevailed throughout the Society on multiple levels. At the senior management tier, Myrella Roy announced her retirement after more than 15 years as a dedicated and passionate Executive Director. Working with many presidents and boards over the years, Myrella's tenure is associated with several CSHP success stories. While it is impossible to list all her achievements, the following highlights underscore the impact she made on both the Society and the pharmacy practice.

Myrella's leadership turned the Society around when it was needed the most. During challenging economic times, she was able to increase membership by 50%. Because of her many accomplishments, it is not surprising that Myrella won multiple awards, including CSHP's Distinguished Service Award and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Canadian Foundation for Pharmacy.

On behalf of CSHP, and all the Board members, volunteers, and members that have come to know Myrella, I would like to thank her for the last 15 years, and offer sincere best wishes for a well-deserved retirement.

Myrella's retirement brought about a need for a new leader to strategically respond to trends affecting the association world at large, such as the growth of niche associations, and more competition for membership and sponsorship dollars. These business models under which CSHP had flourished were no longer enough to deliver the value members expect and deserve. In December 2018, CSHP announced the appointment of Jody Ciufo as our Chief Executive Officer. I am pleased to report Jody has managed the responsibility of handling the shifting association landscape with steady leadership, honed over her lengthy career in not-for-profit direction. The Board has given her a clear mandate to elevate the profile of hospital pharmacists, grow membership, engage the hospital pharmacy community, and amplify the Society's collective voice.

To that end, she and the Executive Committee worked extensively with the Board, Branch Presidents, and affiliated boards to create a strategy to regain sustainability. In a show of unanimous support, the CSHP National office, our branches and affiliated boards agreed to contribute financially towards the common goal of becoming more member-driven, offering more programs, services, educational opportunities, and relevance to today's generation of members, supporters, and students. Jody's leadership marks new beginnings for the Society as we set on a new path towards sustainability and as our 2015-2020 Strategic Plan comes to its natural end. The planning phase for 2020 and beyond is well underway, and as a unified community the Society is poised for growth in the coming decade.

ACHIEVEMENTS AT-A-GLANCE

Staff and Board

This year has brought significant change at the Board and CSHP national office. At the Winnipeg New Board Meeting in October 2018, there were no less than eight fresh faces: Tania Mysak, Presidential Officer (Vision Portfolio), Christina Adams, Treasurer (Finance Portfolio), Ian Creurer, AB, Melanie McLeod, SK, Jarrid McKittrick, MB, Megan Riordon, ON, Andrea Kent, NS, and Chilo Winter, NL. In December 2018, CSHP announced Jody Ciufo as our first CEO, which also marked a change as the first non-pharmacist to lead the organization. In April 2019, the CSHP office welcomed Clara Wicke as our first Director of Marketing and Communications.

Strategic Alliance between CSHP and APES

A new strategic alliance between CSHP and the *Association des pharmaciens des établissements de santé du Québec (APES)* enhanced the relationship between the two organizations and increased respective member benefits. As of December 2018, CSHP members were able to access the same benefits as APES associate members. Similarly, this new agreement allows CSHP to offer interested APES active members the same rights and benefits granted to its individual supporters at no additional cost. Nearly 120 APES members have linked up with CSHP as a result. The alliance is also an ideal backdrop for co-operation on advocacy issues that affect both organizations.

Pharmacy Practice

CSHP weighed in on many topical issues throughout the year, providing input, expertise, and guidance in areas such as drug shortages, a national Pharmacare program, implementation of the mandatory Serious Adverse Event reporting in hospitals, and creating guidelines on the secure management and diversion prevention for controlled drugs and substances in hospitals and healthcare facilities.

A fulsome report on advocacy is included in this annual report, however highlights of some of the key pharmacy practice activities are listed below:

- Changes to the Scheduling of Tramadol
- Proposed Amendments to Canada's Food and Drug Regulations to Require the Reporting of Serious Adverse Drug Reactions by Hospitals
- Notice of Intent to restrict the marketing and advertising of opioids

- Controlled Drugs and Substances in Hospitals and Healthcare Facilities: Guidelines on Secure Management and Diversion Prevention

Contributions to the National Pharmacare Program

For many years, CSHP has been actively contributing to the federal discussions on a national Pharmacare program and in March we welcomed the release of the report from the Advisory Council on the Implementation of *National Pharmacare*. Many recommendations of the Advisory Council's report aligned with CSHP's previously published (2016) position statement on a national Pharmacare program. PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE CONFERENCE (PPC) 2019



At PPC 2019, CSHP celebrated 50 *Amazing Years of Excellence* along with 529 delegates who gathered in Toronto for high quality education and networking opportunities. The keynote session featured Jon Montgomery, Host, *The Amazing Race Canada* and Gold Medal Olympian, Vancouver 2010.

Plenary sessions *Improving Health through Community Design* given by Karen Lee, MD, MHSc, University of Alberta and *Partnering with Patients to Optimize Pharmaceutical Care* presented by Marie-Claude Vanier, BPharm, MSc University of Montreal were a key draw to the conference. In addition, the educational program highlighted CSHP's award-winning presentations, facilitated poster presentations, and Pharmacy Specialty Network (PSN) roundtable discussions. There were also program highlights touching on opioids in primary care and various sessions discussing cannabis-related topics.

During the conference, CSHP paid homage to retiring Executive Director, Myrella Roy, for her 15 years of service, with 16 past presidents of CSHP in attendance at this special retirement send off.

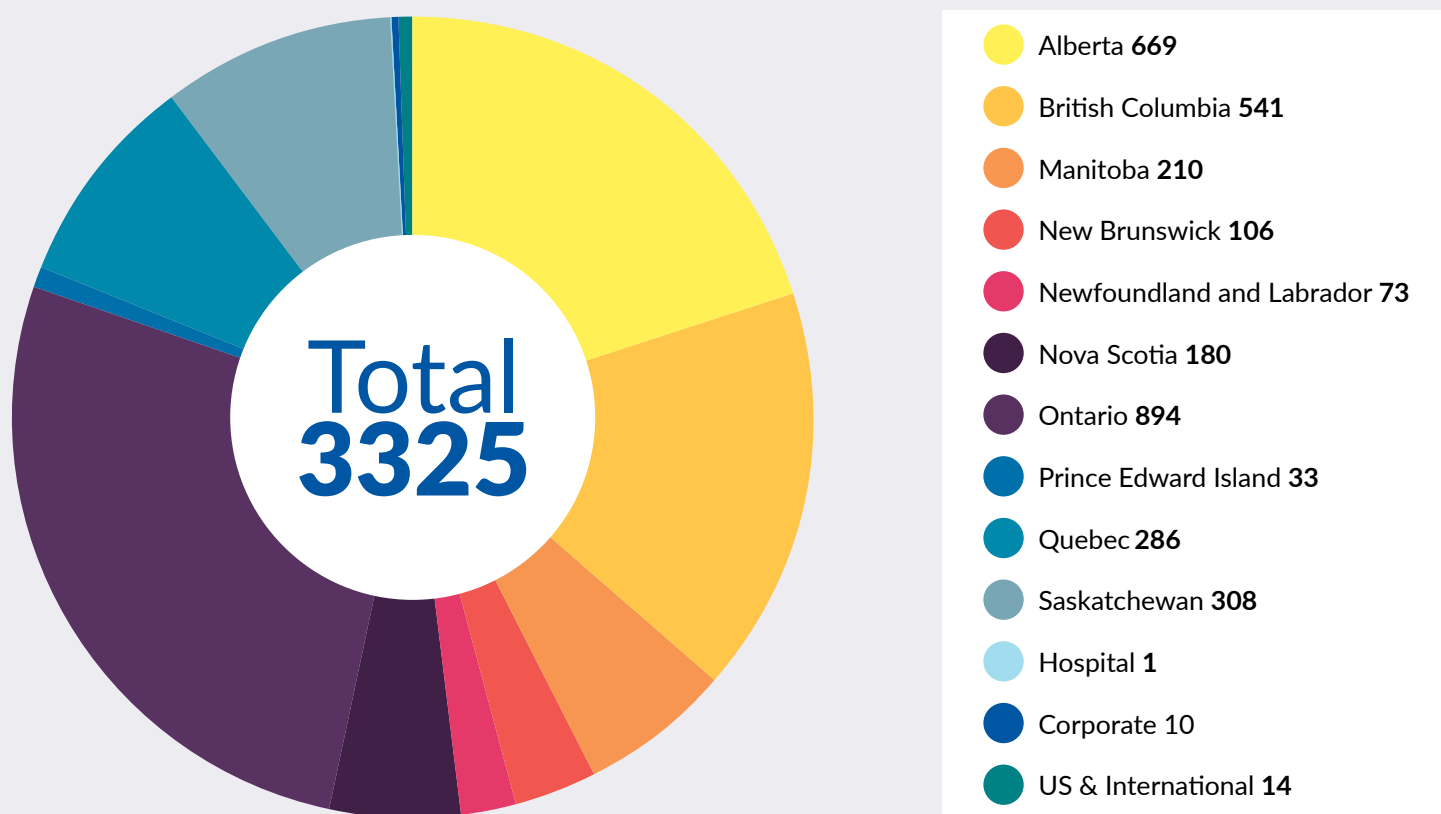

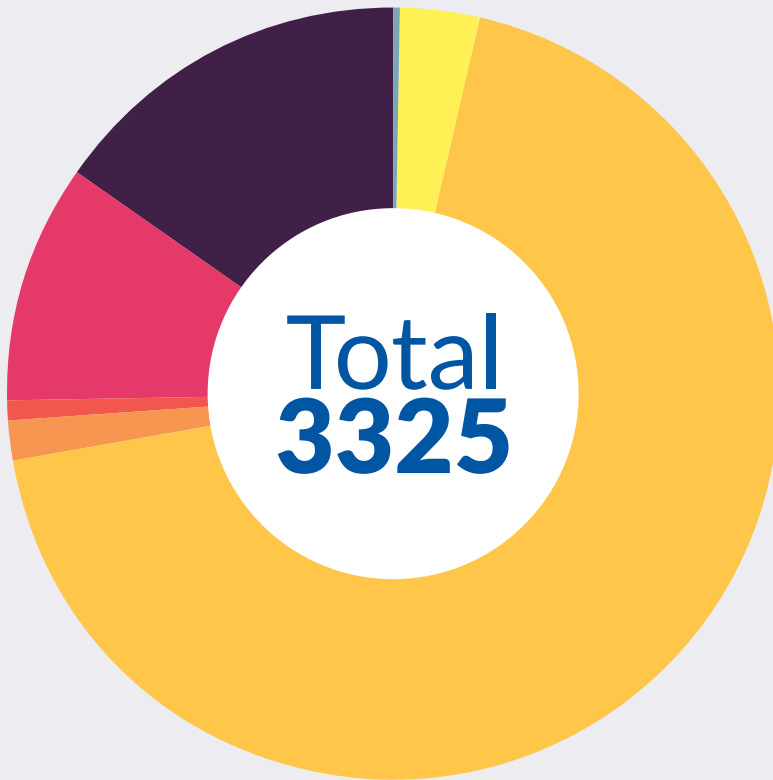

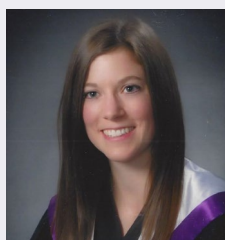

CSHP ADVOCACY

CSHP works collaboratively with many stakeholders in the healthcare sector to leverage one another's expertise, connections, and advocacy success stories. CSHP would like to thank its many stakeholders who helped cover the advocacy agenda through high-level meetings, think tanks, events, and participation in committees.

CSHP continues to enjoy a strong relationship with **Health Canada**. Throughout the year, CSHP was represented in Health Canada meetings on mandatory reporting of serious adverse drug reactions, fraudulent marketing of pharmaceuticals, and commercial compounding.

For many years, CSHP has actively contributed to the federal discussion on a national Pharmacare program and in March 2018 responded to an invitation from the *Advisory Council on the Implementation of National Pharmacare* to participate in a series of cross-Canada roundtables. The CSHP Board voted to endorse the **Statement of Pharmacare Consensus Principles**. In doing so, CSHP joins more than 80 other organizations representing a diverse collection of healthcare professional associations, not-for-profit organizations, labour unions, patients, seniors, and academics.

The *Advisory Council on the Implementation of National Pharmacare* presented its **interim report**. Many of the recommendations and the principles align with CSHP's **position statement** on a national Pharmacare program.

CSHP continues to work with the **Alliance for Safe Online Pharmacies Canada (ASOP)** regarding the potential changes in US legislative framework that would allow for mass importation of drugs from Canada. In the spring of 2019 CSHP participated in a trilateral meeting with Health Canada and the **Canadian Pharmacists Association (CPhA)** to discuss various issues, such as latex content in drugs, biologics naming conventions, and more.

CSHP collaborated with **Prescribing Safely Canada (PSC)-Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada**, to contribute towards the publication of **the Prescribing Safely Canada - Physician Prescribing Competencies**. The CanMEDS 2015 framework and Milestones Guide are used throughout this document for each of the ten competencies described.

CSHP is represented on the **Canadian Council for Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs (CCAPP)** Board of Directors. This year, the CCAPP Board made accreditation decisions for five Canadian pharmacy technician programs and one Canadian pharmacy program. Four accreditation site visits for Canadian pharmacy programs and six accreditation site visits are planned for Canadian pharmacy technician programs in 2019/2020. The CCAPP Board will be engaging in a process over the next year to re-evaluate the fees for both educational accreditation and membership to sustain growth, permit innovation, and implement new strategic actions.

CSHP benefitted from its first representative, Tasha Ramsey, NS to **Immunize Canada National Coalition**. The group's mandate is to contribute to the control, elimination, and eradication of vaccine-preventable diseases in Canada by increasing awareness of the National Advisory Committee on Immunization's (NACI) recommended immunizations for all ages through education, promotion, advocacy, and media relations. Plans are underway to bolster this area for CSHP members and networks by sharing Immunize Canada campaigns (influenza, pneumococcus), obtaining or developing immunization-related educational resources, and creating position statements addressing current issues in immunization.

CSHP Cannabis Task Force – with the change in Canada's legislation governing cannabis coming into effect October of 2018, CSHP heard from its members that there is a need for support and guidance in managing the clinical needs of patients who may use cannabis for medical purposes, as well as on handling cannabis products brought to hospital by patients. At their Midterm Board Meeting, the Board voted to strike a Cannabis Task Force to review and address these issues.

When it comes to advocacy, there is strength in numbers. Throughout spring 2019, CSHP professional staff and Board including Douglas Doucette, President represented CSHP at meetings with representatives from the **Special Access Programme, Office of Controlled Substances**, and the **National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities (NAPRA)**. Additional joint officer meetings were held during the year with **Association des pharmaciens des établissements de santé du Québec (APES)**, **Canadian Association of Pharmacy Students and Interns (CAPSI)**, **Canadian Association of Pharmacy Technicians (CAPT)**, **Institute for Safe Medication Practices (ISMP Canada)**, **Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC)**, and the **Board of Pharmaceutical Specialties (BPS)**.

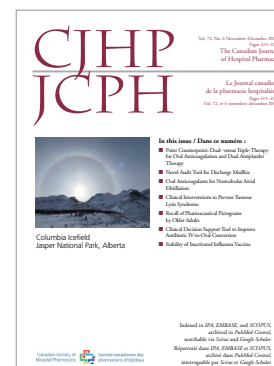


OFFICIAL PUBLICATIONS

The Canadian Journal of Hospital Pharmacy

The Canadian Journal of Hospital Pharmacy (CJHP) celebrated 50 years of consecutive publication in 2019, although its publication history extends back to 1948 when it was published under the title *Bulletin of the Society of Hospital Pharmacists*. Also in 2019, the CJHP celebrated its 10 year anniversary of being online.

The CJHP has featured several distinctive series over the years, such as International Perspectives on Pharmacy Practice from 2015–2018 and Research Primer from 2014–2015. These unique features align with the Journals' strategic goal of being recognized as a respected international publication, serving as a major venue for dissemination of information related to patient-centered pharmacy practice. Based on the results of a 2017 CJHP readership survey, the most recent series, the Advanced Pharmacist Practitioner (APP), was selected to run for the next 2 to 3 years. The intent of this new feature is to provide a collection of resources aimed at enabling hospital pharmacists and pharmacy departments to advance and broaden the scope of pharmacy practice across Canada. The APP series was launched in the January-February 2018 issue of the CJHP when the first manuscript, a review of advanced practice concepts written by Stephen Shalansky, Editor of the CJHP, was published.

Other Official Publications

Through the work of the Pharmacy Practice Publications Steering Committee, CSHP published a new Canadian Medication Optimization Briefing: **Safe Transitions of Care for Patients Taking Opioids** in December of 2018.

CSHP also led the development of **Controlled Drugs and Substances in Hospitals and Healthcare Facilities: Guidelines on Secure Management and Diversion Prevention**, published in March of 2019 in fulfillment of one of its commitments under the Joint Statement of Action to Address the Opioid Crisis.

The guidelines were developed in response to what has become an opioid crisis of extraordinary proportions. This document aims to provide Canadian healthcare facilities with advice and guidance on how to develop a system to prevent, detect, and respond to the diversion of controlled substances and how to continuously improve such a system once it has been established.

Obsolete Publications

CSHP also retired a number of obsolete publications, including: *Homecare: Guidelines on the Role of the Pharmacist*; *Pharmaceutical Care: Statement on Drug Therapy in the Elderly*; *Education Programs: Guidelines to Develop Programs for Hospital Pharmacists*; and *Complementary/Alternative Medicine: Information Paper on the Role of the Pharmacist*.

CANADIAN PHARMACY RESIDENCY BOARD (CPRB)

The Canadian Pharmacy Residency Board (CPRB) consists of nine members who contribute to pharmacy residency practice in Canada. Each member represents a region of Canada and liaises with corresponding program directors and coordinators. Through structured rotations in pharmacy practice, education, research, and administration, residency programs aim to prepare pharmacists for challenging and innovative pharmacy practice. Graduates of pharmacy residency programs are an important source of highly qualified pharmacists trained in institutional practice. An integral part of CSHP's 2015-2020 Strategic Plan is having a clear, proactive plan to meet the needs of entry-to-practice PharmD program graduates. The CPRB initiated several activities throughout the year to support this strategy, including accrediting Year 2 Residency Programs for the first time.

- 9 hospital residency programs accredited by CPRB
- 5 more matched positions from the previous year (116 matched)
- 4 hosted webinars

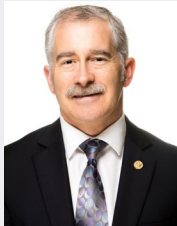
