MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT AND THE CEO

Last year the onset of COVID brought us together to pit our expertise against an unknown, deadly, and volatile virus. The crisis showed us the value of our community and led to a broader, more inclusive membership in this year of so many accomplishments.

We have been gratified and proud to see our profession and the members of our society actually draw closer while we were physically farther apart. We welcomed 346 additional new members over the past year — the single largest year of growth in our history. We are now a community of 3,761 pharmacists, residents, supporters, students, and pharmacy technicians — this latter group has tripled in numbers since 2020 when technicians were first welcomed as full members of CSHP.

While the pandemic may have drawn us together, it's the strength of our improved member focus that demonstrates our value — keeping our current members engaged and bringing new members to our community. A remarkable example is the new Hospital Pharmacy 101 series of learning modules on foundational concepts and skills in hospital pharmacy. Developed by experts and accredited by the Canadian Council of Continuing Education in Pharmacy, the course material sets a new standard for CSHP education.

The second edition of the Together Hospital Pharmacy Conference brought even more of us together with rigorous and inspiring sessions combined with excellent networking, even though remote. Many of the 900 participants told us the virtual program freed them from the barriers of travel approvals, costs, and sustainability concerns.

CSHP is committed to listening and speaking more intentionally about truth and reconciliation in healthcare. In a joint commentary with our Executive Committee colleagues in the *Canadian Journal of Hospital Pharmacy*, we wrote that systemic racism and the legacies of colonialism are public health issues. As healthcare professionals, we recognize that we are accountable for changing the systems and institutions in which we work. We aim to be ready to respond to the direction of Indigenous partners, who maintain authority to determine the way forward. To that end, CSHP celebrated the creation of the Indigenous Pharmacy Professionals of Canada in 2022 by chair and founder Jaris Swidrovich and CEO Amy Lamb. CSHP has opened its networks to amplify the voice of this important partner.

We are grateful to each of one of our 3,761 members for joining to make a difference – in patients' lives, hospital pharmacy, and healthcare systems — together!

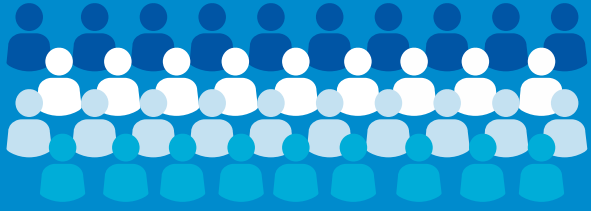

ACHIEVEMENTS AT-A-GLANCE

JOINT SYMPOSIUM WITH A.P.E.S.

This year, CSHP and l'Association des pharmaciens des établissements de santé du Québec (A.P.E.S.) organized our first-ever joint symposium *Pandemic Takeaways for Hospital Pharmacy*. The goal of this event was to look back on the lessons learned in COVID and find ways to turn a challenging time into a unique growth opportunity for pharmacy teams everywhere. On October 28 and 29, attendees came to the Palais des Congrès de Gatineau to take in critical information from a range of experts from Ottawa, across Canada, and from as far away as Hungary, the United Kingdom, and the United States. The sessions touched on the fundamentals of what happened, what we did correctly, what we did incorrectly, as well as how we can best adapt these practices when faced with another pandemic. Following this symposium, CSHP is looking forward to future collaborations with A.P.E.S. as we continue to explore this partnership's possibilities.

NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP SURVEY

This year we received over 1,000 responses to our National Membership Survey. The survey is a comprehensive look at who makes up the CSHP membership, what they care about, and what CSHP can do to make their membership worthwhile. This year, we introduced a section on environmental and climate change issues where our members spoke on sustainability in hospital practice and what they thought were the greatest areas of concern about pharmacy's impact on climate change. They also provided us with many ways pharmacies can have more sustainable practices that we hope to work on implementing on a wide scale.

GOVERNANCE

Based on recommendations from a task force led by former CSHP Treasurer Tamar Koleba, CSHP made major changes to its governance this year and moved to simplify its processes and language in its by-laws and policy documents. As part of a larger package of changes, CSHP members at the October 2022 AGM voted to decrease the minimum number of directors from 16 to 13. Branches are entitled to two delegates if their membership exceeds 500. For years, Ontario was represented by two delegates, but this year, opted for only one as a cost-saving measure. With the CEO no longer a member of the Board, reducing the minimum number of members on the Board allows flexibility to dip lower without having to change our fundamental corporate articles registered with Industry Canada. On the policy front, the Board voted to eliminate the former executive portfolios of Internal, External and Vision to reflect the move away from the Executive operating as a de facto "mini-board," a best practice in governance trends.

ADVOCACY

DRUG SHORTAGES

CSHP plays a key role in advocating for strategies to minimize the impact of drug shortages and continues to call for industries, governments, wholesalers, healthcare providers, and other stakeholders to work together. One of the highlights of that work this year was the appearance of Chief Pharmacy Officer Christina Cella at a U.S. Congressional Briefing where she discussed the concerns surrounding this issue with Canada's neighbour to the south. CSHP also participated in numerous federal multi-stakeholder calls and presentations on the serious impact shortages can have on hospitals, and provided input on behalf of our members when asked.

CSHP's expertise made us an important stakeholder to be consulted on a variety of projects over the past year. Our ongoing engagement with Health Canada saw consultations on drug shortages, participation on committees on medications and treatments (e.g., Zepzelca, Papaverine, and Technetium), as well as important conversations on AHFS classification.



CSHP reviewed and provided feedback on Canadian Council for Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs (CCAPP) standards and curriculum.



Canadian Institute for Health Information

Better data. Better decisions. Healthier Canadians.

CSHP participated in multiple events, including a Best Brains Exchange with the Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) and Health Canada. During this invitation-only gathering, participants examined the current state of antimicrobials in Canada. It was an opportunity for important discussions on the government's policies and allowed us to brainstorm best practices for stewardship.

CSHP WELCOMES INDIGENOUS PHARMACY PROFESSIONALS OF CANADA

Announced by co-chairs Dr. Jaris Swidrovich and Amy Lamb in June 2022, the Indigenous Pharmacy Professionals of Canada (IPPC) is dedicated to eliminating racism and promoting frameworks to ensure culture-safe and affirming environments for Indigenous patients and pharmacy practitioners. "CSHP respects the authority of this Indigenous-led association and will support the direction its board and members set out," says CEO Jody Ciufu. "Amplifying their work is an obligation of our professional society."

The ties are already strong. Incoming President Sean Spina is an inaugural member of IPPC's founding Board of Directors and a member of the Métis Nation British Columbia. The relationship has allowed us to spread the work of the IPPC and to examine CSHP's own programs in initial areas such as governance and residency accreditation. We were honoured and educated by the co-chairs' address to the CSHP Board and the 2022 AGM.

CSHP facilitated a historic multistakeholder meeting in conjunction with the AGM involving IPPC, the Canadian Pharmacists Association, the Canadian Pharmacy Residency Board, the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada, the Association of Faculties of Pharmacy in Canada, the National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities, the Canadian Council for Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs and the Canadian Association of Pharmacy Technicians. It was a groundbreaking discussion on Indigenous engagement with the leaders of Canadian pharmacy.

HOSPITAL PHARMACY 101

With the launch of Hospital Pharmacy 101 in October 2022, CSHP is making its first major foray into an online self-directed learning program. Thanks to hard work and collaboration by expert teams, we now have an eight-module program accredited by the Canadian Council on Continuing Education in Pharmacy (CCCEP) for 12.5CEUs.

The modules are available through an on-line portal, which allows participants to work through the material at their own pace. The program was designed to be used either in its entirety for those new to hospital pharmacy or in stand-alone modules for those looking for more information for a specific topic.

The original idea surfaced approximately five years ago when members noted a need for some basic training that could bridge any knowledge gaps or serve as an important refresher. The CSHP Professional Practice team worked alongside the Educational Development Committee to identify pertinent topics. Potential topics were validated with hospital leadership who were asked what would be the most relevant and helpful for their staff. Learning objectives were set, expert writers were selected and the modules were written then peer-reviewed before being sent off to CCCEP for accreditation.

With Hospital Pharmacy 101, CSHP begins a new era of asynchronous, self-directed learning for members and the broader pharmacy community to get the on-the-ground knowledge they need to meet patients' need in hospitals and other collaborative healthcare settings.

DISCHARGE MEDICATION MANAGEMENT TOOLKIT

Hospital pharmacies are in a unique position to optimize discharge medication management for successful transitions back to primary care and community-based providers. Using the evidence-based bundle of discharge activities in this toolkit, pharmacy teams can minimize readmissions and address discharge barriers, resulting in a more seamless transition of care for patients. Featured activities include discharge medication reconciliation, pharmacist prescribing (as permitted based on provincial legislation), discharge patient education, and pharmacist-led post discharge follow-up. Strategies to implement these discharge activities and to advocate for necessary resources while mitigating potential barriers are also discussed. This members-only toolkit was developed by CSHP's Professional Practice Vision Committee under the leadership of Co-Chairs Arden Barry and Jennifer Shiu.

WEBINARS

As a part of CSHP's regular webinar series, members have shared their expertise on a variety of clinical topics, providing attendees with excellent learning opportunities. In addition to highlighting specific niches of interest, these events also provide a way for members to further develop themselves and connect with our community. This year we covered such topics as:

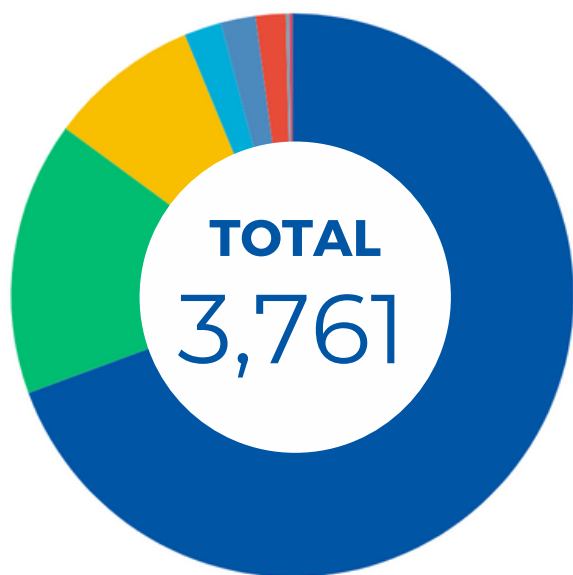

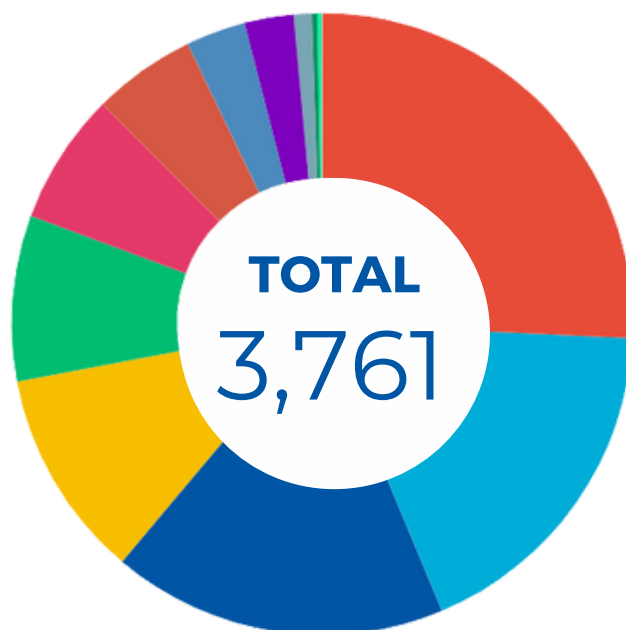
2021 - 2022 MEMBERSHIP BY CATEGORY

PHARMACY RESIDENCY APPLICATION ROADMAP

The Pharmacy Residency Application Roadmap Program saw plenty of growth in its sophomore year. CSHP created the roadmap to help applicants navigate the competitive process of applying for a residency. The course, which focuses on the detailed workings of various residency programs and how to apply, changed its delivery method this year for all but one of the modules so that registrants could better accommodate the program in their busy schedules. This year, the program had 82 paid registrants — a 26% increase over last year. Sixty participants took advantage of the individual review of their curriculum vitae (c.v.) and letters of intent. Of those, 54 participated in mock interviews. Because of the increase in participants, we expanded the number of reviewers and interviewers so all who took part could benefit from a thorough examination of their documents or interview abilities. As in the first year, the general information webinar about residency is free and open to all.



PHARMACY RESIDENCY APPLICATION AND MATCHING SERVICE

The Pharmacy Residency Application and Matching Service (PRAMS) received a large number of applications this year and posted a success rate of 37%. PRAMS is the national service that helps applicants obtain positions in programs of their choice and helps programs get applicants of choice. Of the 496 applications received and 1639 credits purchased, 347 of them were successfully completed. From these applicants, 130 possible positions were filled.

ACCREDITED PROGRAMS

The Canadian Pharmacy Residency Board (CPRB) spent this year taking 17 different programs through varying parts of the accreditation process. There are two new programs pending accreditation, three are pending re-accreditation, seven were accredited from fall 2021 to spring 2022, and five programs were surveyed in fall.

CJHP EARLY ACCESS

New this year is CJHP's Early Access service. It features a selection of full-text, peer-reviewed, and copy-edited articles that are available ahead of their publication in a regular online issue of the *Canadian Journal of Hospital Pharmacy*. As soon as these articles are published in regular issues, they are removed from the Early Access area. They then appear along with the associated page numbers and volume/issue details in the assigned online issue. Early Access articles are assigned a Digital Object Identifier (DOI), which allows the articles to be cited and tracked before being assigned to an issue.

CITATIONS

Scopus, Elsevier's abstract and citation database, measures the average citations received per document published in the *CJHP*. This is referred to as a CiteScore, which is calculated as the total number of citations to content published in the CiteScore year and the previous three years, divided by the total number of items published by the Journal in the CiteScore year and prior three years. In 2021, the *CJHP*'s CiteScore was 1.4. More specifically, the Journal was cited 215 times out of 150 source documents. So far, the *CJHP*'s CiteScore in 2022 is 1.5 having been cited 157 times out of 108 source documents.

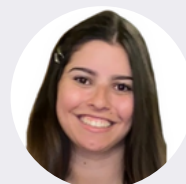

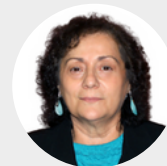
