CADTH and Scientific Advice

HTA agencies such as CADTH have an ever expanding role when it comes to provision of quality pharmaceutical care. This presentation will provide an overview of CADTH products and services, explain how pharmacists can access, use or generate these services, and describe the Early Scientific Advice process. CADTH provides health care decision makers with objective evidence to help make informed decisions about the optimal use of health technologies, including drugs, tests and devices. In addition to evidence, CADTH provides advices, recommendations and tools. CADTH engages with clinicians and patients through all products and services. In addition to Drug Reimbursement Recommendations, and Health Technology Management, in 2015, CADTH launched an Early Scientific Advice program. This program is a voluntary, non-binding, and confidential fee-for-service consultation process that engages clinical and economic experts as well as CADTH methodologists in early dialogue about the drug development process.

Featured Plenary and Moderated Panel Discussion

Succession Planning in Pharmacy

In this 90 minute interactive panel discussion on Succession Planning within Healthcare organizations, participants will have the opportunity to better understand the importance of organizational succession planning and why it is critical to maintain the level of care we provide within our systems. Panel members will share the current level of preparedness among Canadian Hospital Pharmacy departments surrounding succession planning, as well as the sense of urgency that exists among Canadian Hospital Pharmacists. The discussion will also allow participants to gain an appreciation for what succession planning is, discuss formal and informal succession planning strategies, and how the development of succession plans can lead to positive employee and patient impacts within our systems.

In addition, participants can expect to learn about organizational strategies to effectively identify and develop potential successors, and how pharmacists might prepare themselves for future leadership roles. Strategies contained within the literature will be discussed, and participants will be challenged to reflect upon how these may or may not fit within their organizations. Personal perspectives and authentic case examples related to succession planning and leadership development will also be shared, allowing participants to understand how the theory of succession planning has been applied within healthcare teams.

Finally, participants will have the opportunity to learn about organizational and personal barriers, both perceived and real, that exist in succession planning, and how these challenges may be addressed within our systems.

Management Principles of Acute Pain in People Stabilized on Buprenorphine

Buprenorphine is quickly becoming a popular treatment for opioid use disorder and chronic pain. However, difficulty arises in the treatment of acute pain due to buprenorphine's high affinity for, but low stimulation of opioid receptors. This presentation will give information on how to manage acute pain in people stabilized on buprenorphine.

Confronting Opioid Use Disorder: Utilizing the Emergency Department to Combat the Epidemic

Opioid use disorder is a chronic and relapsing condition which has presented a major challenge to the health care system. Information from Health Canada indicated that in 2017, there were 10.9 per 100,000 opioid related deaths (34% increase from 2016). Many harm reduction strategies that have been implemented to help combat this epidemic (naloxone kits, safe injection sites) however, are insufficient on their own. National organizations are supporting the use of opioid agonist therapy (in particular buprenorphine-naloxone) as the mainstay of treatment. Current literature suggests that opioid agonist therapy may be initiated in the emergency department – this has resulted in greater treatment retention, lower self-reported relapse rates and reduced overdoses compared to brief intervention or referral to clinic.

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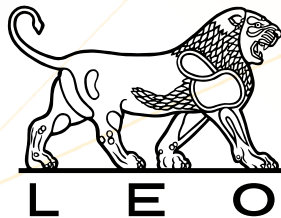
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
