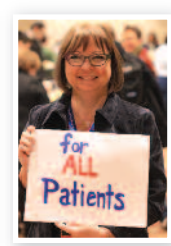
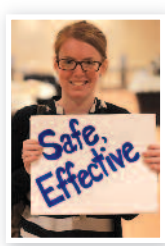

Margaret Colquhoun, BScPhm, RPh, FCSHP



Margaret Colquhoun graduated with her Pharmacy degree from the University of Toronto and began her career in hospital pharmacy at Kingston General Hospital. She quickly moved to work in one of the most modern hospital pharmacies in Canada at the time, University Hospital in London. There Brian Dinel immediately encouraged Marg to become involved in CSHP and suggested her name to debate Jane Gillespie at the PPC (a bit like David and Goliath). Next came volunteering for committee work in 1979 as Chairman of the Drug Information Committee which continued through Ontario Branch executive positions, CSHP national council, the Ontario College of Pharmacists council and the Ontario Pharmacists council as CSHP representative over the next many years. She served on many committees and completed a term on the Board of Fellows in 2011. Marg considers the connections and friendships made in CSHP to be a great gift.

Marg has always been passionate about leadership and hospital pharmacy. She held leadership positions at Foothills Hospital, York Central Hospital, Princess Margaret Hospital, and Markham Stouffville Hospital and consulted for several years nationally and internationally. When the profession began to learn about patient safety and the unreliability of medication systems in 2001 she immediately focussed her career on medication system safety, joining ISMP Canada in its early days, and leading many significant projects including the Ontario Concentrated KCI project, and the Safer Healthcare Now Intervention for medication reconciliation in Canada. This resulted in the privilege of leading the World Health Organization's multi country medication reconciliation intervention for 6 years, sharing a wealth of Canadian experience.

In 2014 the Ontario College of Pharmacists was given the authority to inspect hospital pharmacy practice for the first time and Marg joined the team to develop and implement criteria for inspection. This exciting project is already resulting in changes in hospital pharmacy practice in the province. As part of this recent process she has reconnected with people across the province that became friends over her years of being involved in CSHP.

Marg has received other CSHP awards, including the Isabel E. Stauffer Meritorious Service Award.

The Distinguished Service Award is given in recognition of outstanding achievement in hospital pharmacy practice. It is awarded for significant contributions to hospital pharmacy practice and to CSHP at the National and Branch/Chapter levels. Individuals are nominated by their peers.

Barbara A. Thomas, Diploma of Pharmacy, Pharm D.



Dr. Barbara Thomas is Clinical Pharmacist, Mental Health & Addictions, Waterford Hospital, Eastern Health, St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador. She holds cross-appointments as Clinical Assistant Professor with the School of Pharmacy and the Faculty of Medicine (Discipline of Psychiatry) at Memorial University of Newfoundland and is Professional Associate in the Doctorate of Clinical Psychology (PsyD) Program. Barbara received her Diploma of Pharmacy from the College of the North Atlantic, St. John's and her Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of Colorado Skaggs School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, Denver, Colorado.

Dr. Thomas been active in the pharmacy profession throughout her career. She was part of the Executive Committee as President-Elect during the inception of CSHP NL Branch in 1996. She is Past President of CSHP NL Branch and served on CSHP National Council as NL Branch Delegate from 2000 to 2003. Barbara is currently the Chair of CSHP NL Branch Awards Committee, the President of the Canadian Council on Continuing Education in Pharmacy (CCCEP) and Chair of the Registration and Licensing Committee of the Newfoundland and Labrador Pharmacy Board.

Barbara was the first pharmacist assigned to the Mental Health Services at Eastern Health and over the past 20 years has seen this role expand immensely. She works with three inpatient multi-disciplinary teams to ensure delivery of optimal medication care. Dr. Thomas is highly regarded as a clinician, patient educator and teacher/mentor to pharmacy, medical and clinical psychology students. Recently, she has taken on a Regional Clinical Leadership role within the Pharmacy Services Program at Eastern Health specifically to mentor and guide pharmacists as they embark on new clinical roles within the organization. She also provides lectures on the use of psychiatric medications to the School of Nursing at Memorial. She has been recognized for her teaching and mentorship through awards including the Faculty of Medicine (Discipline of Psychiatry) Academic Teacher Award. Recently, Barbara became part of the Early Psychosis Research Collaborative.

Dr. Thomas has been the recipient of numerous awards including the CSHP NL Branch Alfred G. Dawe Distinguished Service Award, CSHP NL Branch Leadership in Pharmacy Practice Award, The Takeda Magnum Opus Award and the James C. Quick Award (for innovative pharmacy practice) from the Pharmacists' Association of Newfoundland and Labrador. Barbara also received the March Award from the Schizophrenia Society of Newfoundland and Labrador recognizing outstanding commitment and devotion to people with schizophrenia and their families.

Hilary Rowe, BScPharm, ACPR, PharmD



Dr. Hilary Rowe is a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in Maternal Fetal Medicine at Surrey Memorial Hospital and the new co-author of Medications and Mothers' Milk. Dr. Rowe obtained her Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy and Doctor of Pharmacy at the University of British Columbia in 2009 and 2012. She acquired her Hospital Residency with the Vancouver Island Health Authority in 2010.

Upon completion of her PharmD, Hilary took the initiative to meet a world-renowned expert in medications and breastfeeding at a lactation conference, and arranged a 2-week experiential learning opportunity with this expert. During this rotation and further collaborations Hilary gained expertise in drugs in breastmilk. Since May 2012 Hilary started co-authoring a reference handbook titled Medications and Mothers' Milk. Her first edition of this 1275 page handbook that allows healthcare practitioners around the world to have current information about the suitability of medications in breastmilk was published in May 2014. Hilary's dedication to her patients and professional growth is further illustrated by her research in this specialty population; Hilary already has 8 publications and multiple research projects underway.

Hilary is also dedicated to provide direct education to others to enhance their knowledge of pregnancy and breastfeeding issues. She provides continuing education sessions for healthcare professionals locally and internationally. She is committed to the development of other healthcare professionals to help them achieve practice excellence. She educates others through her involvement with the CSHP Mentorship program, precepting pharmacy residents, lecturing nursing students, teaching UBC Family Medicine residents, and as a pharmacy instructor at UBC. She has also advocated for the creation of a CSHP PSN specifically for Maternal Fetal Medicine. Her passion for educating others is clear as Hilary was awarded the "Lower Mainland Pharmacy Services New Preceptor of the Year Award."

Finally, Hilary is the "go to" person for medication questions regarding pregnant or breastfeeding patients not just on her ward, where she is a highly respected member of the health care team, but throughout the hospital, and surrounding community. Her passion for ensuring the patients receive not only acceptable therapy but optimal therapy is a direct result of her dedication to these patients.

Jaris Swidrovich, BSP, PharmD



Born and raised in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Jaris Swidrovich graduated from the University of Saskatchewan with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy (BSP) in 2010, followed by a year of practice in community pharmacy, hospital pharmacy, and public health settings. Jaris went on to complete a post-baccalaureate Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) between Fall 2011 and Summer 2013 at the University of Toronto, making him the first Aboriginal Doctor of Pharmacy in Canada.

Following completion of his PharmD degree, and after a few months of extensive traveling, Jaris returned to Saskatoon where he is currently employed as a Clinical Coordinator of Pharmaceutical Services with the Saskatoon Health Region at St. Paul's Hospital. His portfolio of responsibility includes adult internal medicine and emergency medicine, with his own clinical practice working with inpatients living with HIV/AIDS and addictions. Jaris also works as a moderator for the Canadian Pharmacists Association's (CPhA) ADAPT program and as a clinical pharmacist for the University of Saskatchewan College of Pharmacy and Nutrition Medication Assessment Centre's (MAC) brand new Aboriginal outreach satellite clinic at the Student Wellness Initiative Toward Community Health (SWITCH) student-run inner-city clinic.

Jaris has been recognized by his peers with the Pharmacists' Association of Saskatchewan New Horizon Award in May 2014 and with the Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists (CSHP) Saskatchewan Branch New Hospital Pharmacy Practitioner Award in October 2014. During his time at the University of Toronto, Jaris was recognized with the University of Toronto President's Award for the Outstanding Native Student of the Year in 2013. Jaris has a number of publications (both published and pending publication) and has delivered multiple professional oral and poster presentations locally, nationally, and internationally.

Jaris has acted as a preceptor for undergraduate pharmacy students from the University of Saskatchewan, as well as for pharmacy residents with the Saskatoon Health Region. Jaris is currently the President of the Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists Saskatchewan Branch and serves on numerous other committees and boards, such as the University of Saskatchewan College of Pharmacy and Nutrition PharmD Curriculum Steering Committee and the City of Saskatoon Cultural Diversity and Race Relations Committee. Jaris has also recently created, and is the chair of, the Aboriginal Health Pharmacist Specialty Network (PSN) with CSHP.

Outside of pharmacy, Jaris usually finds himself cycling, participating in bootcamps and recreational weight-lifting, volunteering, tutoring Aboriginal health science students, traveling, and spending time with his five nieces and nephews.

The New Hospital Pharmacy Practitioner Award is given annually to one or two new hospital pharmacy practitioners who, through their service to patient care, to education or research, to the profession and to CSHP, are deemed worthy of recognition. These individuals exhibit promising leadership, dedication and commitment to practice excellence and professional growth.

She was also a member of The Dosettes, a female vocal quintet that performed at various pharmacy student functions. Besides pharmacy and music, her interests include baking and cooking, gardening, hiking, and enjoying the great outdoors. Katherine looks forward to embarking on her career, and hopes to complete a pharmacy residency program after she graduates in June 2015.

Shirin Abadi, B.Sc.(Pharm.), ACPR, Pharm.D.



Dr. Shirin Abadi is Clinical Pharmacy Specialist & Pharmacy Education Coordinator, BC Cancer Agency (Vancouver). She also teaches at the University of British Columbia, as a Clinical Associate Professor of Pharmacy and an Associate Member of the Faculty of Medicine. Shirin obtained her Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy degree from the University of British Columbia, her accredited Hospital Pharmacy Residency certificate from Lions Gate Hospital, and her Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of Toronto. She is the first Canadian recipient of the ASHP Pharmacy Leadership Academy (PLA) Scholarship from the CSHP Research & Education Foundation. Currently, Shirin is pursuing an Executive MBA degree at Simon Fraser University.

Shirin is a dedicated and very active member of CSHP. She has served as BC Branch President-elect, President and Past-President. As the BC Branch President, Shirin led the effort to successfully address the proposal by the Health Employer's Association of BC to remove the temporary market wage adjustment for hospital pharmacists. She led and managed the production of the video "CSHP BC Branch Hospital Pharmacists - YouTube", a TV ad,

a Vancouver Sun publication, and a timely meeting with BC's Minister of Health to promote and advocate for the impact of hospital pharmacists on improved patient health outcomes and reduced healthcare costs. On a national level, Shirin has served as a Mentor, CJHP Reviewer, SES Host Taskforce Member, and Awards Appraiser. In 2013, she was elected BC Branch Delegate to the CSHP Board.

Shirin has shown leadership in her role as a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in Oncology. She successfully proposed the implementation of a new clinical pharmacist role in Ambulatory Care Oncology and ensured its success through the documentation and communication of clinically important pharmacist interventions. She also designed and implemented a system of Clinical Metrics for all Distribution and Clinical Pharmacy Roles at the BC Cancer Agency. Her other areas of practice development have include a Venous Thromboembolism (VTE) Prophylaxis Initiative, Medication Reconciliation in the inpatient and outpatient oncology clinics and an Oncology Education Program for pharmacists. She is the principal investigator on three major research projects related to these areas of practice and has shared her expertise both provincially and nationally through multiple presentations at professional and scientific meetings.

As an active teacher Shirin has, to date, been the Primary Preceptor for over 50 pharmacy residents, undergraduate and PharmD students. In 2013, she received the Preceptor of the Year Award, recognizing her significant role in the Pharmacy Practice Residency Program, BC Cancer Agency.

Erica D. Greanya Otto, BScPharm, ACPR, PharmD



Dr. Erica Greanya is Clinical Pharmacy Specialist, Critical Care and Stroke, Victoria General Hospital, British Columbia and Clinical Assistant Professor, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, University of British Columbia. She completed her undergraduate pharmacy degree at the Faculty of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, University of Alberta, her Hospital Pharmacy Residency at Vancouver Hospital and Health Sciences Centre and her Doctor of Pharmacy degree at the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, University of British Columbia.

Erica has been active in the work of CSHP at both the BC Branch and national levels for several years. She has been member of the CSHP National Summer Educational Sessions - Host Committee Task Force (2011), member of CSHP BC-Branch awards committee, a Reviewer for Ontario Branch publication award (2008-10), Chair, CSHP National, Solid Organ Transplant Pharmacy Specialty Network and Primary liaison to national CSHP and the CSHP Educational Services Committee (2005-10), CSHP-BC Branch Programs Committee member (2006-07), CSHP-BC Branch Executive (2006-07), CSHP National Education Services Committee BC representative (2006-07), and a member of the CSHP Banff Seminar Planning Committee.

After completing her PharmD in 2006, Dr. Greanya initiated her practice as a Pharmacy Specialist with the Solid Organ Transplant program at Vancouver General Hospital. In her role with the transplant program, she provided inpatient and outpatient clinical pharmacy services to kidney, liver and lung transplant recipients in British Columbia. In 2012, Erica moved even further west, and joined Island Health as a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in Critical Care and Stroke at Victoria General Hospital. She provides clinical services to the neuro-intensive care unit as well as inpatient stroke and outpatient stroke/TIA patients through the Stroke Rapid Assessment Unit.

Dr. Greanya has participated extensively in clinical research related to solid organ transplant medications. She has authored several original papers and case reports.

As a Clinical Assistant Professor with the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at the University of British Columbia, with longstanding participation in precepting and teaching for the hospital pharmacy residency programs and PharmD program in British Columbia. She has frequently shared her expertise with colleagues through participation in several pharmacy inservice education programs.

Michael A. LeBlanc, BSc (Chem), B.Sc (Pharm), Pharm.D.



Dr. Michael LeBlanc is Clinical Manager of Pharmacy Services and Clinical Oncology Pharmacy Specialist at the Moncton Hospital site of Horizon Health Network, New Brunswick. Michael graduated with a Bachelor of Science (Chemistry) with Honours from Dalhousie University in 1995. He then went on to receive his Bachelor of Pharmacy degree in 1998 from Memorial University of Newfoundland, St. John's, and his Doctor of Pharmacy degree in 2009 from Idaho State University. He began his pharmacy career as a staff pharmacist at the Dr. Georges L. Dumont Hospital in Moncton, NB before moving to St. John's, NL in 2004 to join the pharmacy team at the Health Sciences Centre and subsequently the Dr. H. Bliss Murphy Cancer Centre as part of Eastern Health. Michael returned to Moncton in 2009 and began his role as part of the local pharmacy leadership team at The Moncton Hospital.

After joining as a student in 1995, Dr. LeBlanc began contributing to CSHP as a member of the Education Committee of CSHP NL. Since that time he has held numerous leadership positions including NB Branch Delegate (1999-2002), NL Branch President (2005-07), Chair of the National Bylaws Committee (2001-02), and as a member and current Chair of the National Advocacy Committee (2012-present). He is also active in other professional organisations such as the Canadian Association of Pharmacists in Oncology and the Haematology/Oncology Pharmacists Association.

Michael's clinical practice experience has included the areas of Mental Health, Cardiology and Palliative Care. Since 2004, Dr. LeBlanc has specialized in the area of Oncology pharmacy. As a result of a major patient care research program at the Dr. H. Bliss Murphy Cancer Clinic (St. John's), he and his fellow researchers developed a new Oncology pharmacy practice model that involves pharmacist intervention at the point of prescribing chemotherapy, provision of education to patient and caregivers, baseline toxicity assessment, follow up toxicity assessment post-treatment and seamless care for patients who will be cared for by other healthcare providers. He was instrumental in its adoption at both the St. John's site and in his current practice at The Moncton Hospital. As a Clinical Manager, he has supported the work of the pharmacy Infectious Disease Specialist, advocated for VTE prevention programs and overseen the implementation of an ambulatory care Anticoagulation Service.

Dr. LeBlanc's areas of clinical research include the prevention and management of toxicities secondary to anti-cancer therapies, assessment and prediction of non-adherence to oral anti-cancer therapies and the prevention of venous thromboembolic events.

Dr. Colette Raymond is Research and Education Coordinator, Department of Pharmacy, University Health Network and Faculty Coordinator, Office of Experiential Education, Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Toronto. She also holds the positions of Research Scientist, Manitoba Centre for Health Policy, and Assistant Professor, Department of Community Health Sciences, University of Manitoba. Dr. Raymond obtained her Bachelor of Science, Pharmacy from the University of Alberta, an accredited Hospital Pharmacy Residency certificate from the Ottawa Hospital, a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of British Columbia and a MSc in Health Services Research from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Manitoba.

Colette has demonstrated support and leadership to the profession through extensive involvement with CSHP at both the Branch and National levels, becoming an active member during her Residency in 1998. She has served as Manitoba representative and Senior Chair of the national Advocacy Committee and in her role as a member of the CSHP Manitoba Branch executive, took a lead role around initiatives related to pharmacist prescribing and the Pharmaceutical Act.
