## Donald Kuntz, BSP



Don Kuntz graduated from the University of Saskatchewan with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy in 1981. His career in hospital pharmacy began in the fall of 1981 when he joined the research team studying workload measurement under then Dean Bruce Schnell, travelling Canada and observing hospital pharmacists and technicians in action. In 1983, Don accepted his first hospital pharmacist job at the now closed Plains Health Centre in Regina. The plan was to stay for six months and now 33 years later, his career with the Regina Qu'Appelle Health Region pharmacy services continues. After working as a staff pharmacist for 12 years he began his role as a clinical coordinator with a cardiology focus for 10 years. When a clinical coordinator role was created at the Wascana Rehabilitation Centre to enhance clinical pharmacy at this facility, Don accepted the challenge. A major initiative in 2005 began with a Saskatchewan Health Quality Council Research Grant to establish medication reconciliation on admission to long term care and reduce polypharmacy.

The process has evolved into a full pharmaceutical care consultation, allergy verification and vaccination history plus medication reconciliation for each admission. Over the past 12 years Don has been clinical coordinator for the anticoagulation clinic and the renal program including dialysis, transplant and chronic renal failure clinic pharmacists. Don was seconded to the Quality Improvement Unit in 2008-9 as manager of the medication reconciliation on admission initiative to acute care for the health region.

Don received the Saskatchewan Branch Pharmacist of the Year in 2005, the JL Summers Achievement Award in 2010 and two CSHP Pharmaceutical Care Awards in 2000 and 2001. He was a finalist for the Saskatchewan Healthcare Excellence Award in 2005. Don received a Saskatchewan College of Pharmacists Presidential Citation in April 2015.

Don has been a preceptor for pharmacy residents in cardiology, anticoagulation long term care/geriatrics rotations for the past 25 years in addition to SPEP, students and interns.

A CSHP member since 1981, Don has served on education and finance committees at the branch level and as Branch Delegate for eight years. Don has served on national committees, work groups, task forces and steering committees including strategic planning, AGM host committee, CSHP 2015 Initiative and Key Performance Indicator Collaborative.

Don continues to be a clinical coordinator in Regina at the Wascana Rehabilitation Centre where he focuses on direct care to patients with high level needs.

## Carolee Awde, R.Ph., B.Sc.Pharm., C.D.E.



Carolee Awde graduated in 1979 with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy from the University of Toronto. After graduation she returned to her hometown of Peterborough for 3 years of community practice. In 1983 she joined the Peterborough Regional Health Center, then the Civic Hospital, where she presently works in the Geriatric Assessment and Intervention Network program as a geriatric assessor.

She was instrumental in establishing clinical pharmacy services and maintained the drug information centre. Working in a community nonteaching hospital allowed her to experience many facets of practice but her heart is in palliative care. She has developed resources and taught palliative care and symptom management. Her volunteer work with Hospice Peterborough and her children's activities earned her a hospital award for volunteer service early in her career. Carolee initiated and developed programs in palliative care, pharmaceutical care, asthma management, pediatric diabetes management, swallowing assessment, the renal insufficiency clinic and the dialysis program.

She has served on many hospital committees in her 30 years of service at PRHC and been involved in the development of patient education programs, care maps and order sets. Carolee worked at the Ross Memorial Hospital for 3 years where she was privileged to use an Ontario Branch Pharmaceutical Care Grant to initiate several clinical programs. She has maintained community pharmacy ties, actively involved with the local association and with the Peterborough Networked Family Health Team utilizing her Diabetes Educator certification. Her work with interdisciplinary teams was recognized by the OPA Collaborative Care Award and the PRHC Lifetime Achievement Award.

Carolee has presented at CSHP conferences: an oral paper on utilizing CADD pumps in palliation, a poster from her nephrology practice, and at the Palliative PSN sessions. Her advice on application to the Fellows Program in "Hospital Pharmacy in Ontario" is posted on the CSHP website. She has been a preceptor for undergraduate pharmacist students and interns from U of T, Waterloo, Dalhousie and U Saskatchewan and for pharmacy technicians during the recent initiation of technician registration in Ontario. She taught bridging program courses and developed and taught pharmacology courses for the new pharmacy technician program at Fleming College.

Carolee has volunteered with CSHP in many roles, and is active with the Risk Management Task Force and a Branch working group to develop a new revenue stream. She was President of and Council delegate for Ontario Branch.

Besides pharmacy, her interests include needlecrafts, mystery fiction, nature and travel.

## Olivia Gayan Ng, BScPhm, RPh, PharmD



Olivia Ng is a clinical pharmacist in thoracic surgery and respiratory at Toronto General Hospital, University Health Network (UHN) and an adjunct lecturer at the Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Toronto. She received a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy from the University of Toronto in 2012 and a post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Pharmacy from the University of Colorado in 2015.

As a clinical pharmacist, she is dedicated to patient-focused care in collaboration with the interprofessional team and fellow pharmacy colleagues. She has been actively involved at UHN in creating a medical marijuana policy. During her time as a PharmD student, Olivia completed a rotation at the Institute for Safe Medication Practices Canada, where she reviewed medication incidents and drafted bulletins providing recommendations to hospitals across Canada. She also completed rotations at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in the cardiovascular intensive care unit, and has had a poster abstract accepted at the Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists (CSHP) Professional Practice Conference in 2016. Olivia also worked as a pharmacist volunteer at the Toronto Pan Am and Parapan Am Games in 2015 and as a pharmacist for the Exceptional Access Program (EAP), Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.

As an adjunct lecturer at the Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy, Olivia has been involved with lecturing in the Interprofessional Pain Curriculum, and has served as a clinical teaching assistant in courses across the various years. She has served as a preceptor for various rotations, ranging from the Early Practice Experience to Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experience (APPE). She is a mentor through the Pharmacy Mentorship Program and a panelist on the APPE preceptor award panel. Outside of the Faculty of Pharmacy, Olivia has mentored medical students in the Faculty of Medicine Transition to Clerkship program.

Olivia maintains a strong leadership role in various organizations. At CSHP, she is an active member of the National Membership Committee and Metro Toronto Chapter. ## Ashley N Walus, BScPharm, ACPR



Ashley Walus graduated from the University of Manitoba with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy in 2011 and completed her hospital pharmacy residency with the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA) in 2012. After her residency she worked at the Health Sciences Centre – Children’s Hospital as a pediatric acute medicine and oncology pharmacist. In 2013, Ashley partnered with Pediatric Infectious Diseases to design and pilot the first antimicrobial stewardship program in Manitoba. Currently she is piloting a new role for clinical pharmacists within the WRHA Home Care Program, another first for the province. She frequently precepts residents and students both in clinical care rotations and in research projects.

Ashley’s passion for improving health equity and interprofessional collaborative practice are evident in her work with the Winnipeg Interprofessional Student-Run Health (WISH) Clinic. The WISH Clinic is a joint initiative between the University of Manitoba and Mount Carmel Clinic (an inner city community health centre), with support from the WRHA. Ashley has been an integral part of the organization since her second year of pharmacy school, and has served as the Executive Co-Chair and the inaugural Volunteer Coordinator.

She continues to volunteer with the WISH Clinic as the lead pharmacist preceptor and loves to teach students from all health disciplines the value of collaboration in advancing health care delivery while meeting the needs of patients no matter what their social circumstance. She has presented at national and international conferences regarding the value of student-facilitated clinics.

Ashley has been involved with CSHP since she was a student and is currently the Manitoba Branch President. Other CSHP roles have included: Branch Awards Chair, Secretary, Student Representative and CSHP 2015 Branch Champion for Manitoba. She has written Practice Directions for the College of Pharmacists of Manitoba in order to help operationalize the new Pharmaceutical Act and Regulations.

When she isn’t working or volunteering in the pharmacy community, Ashley enjoys baking for friends and family, reading, travelling and spending time with her dog Sally and cat Molly.

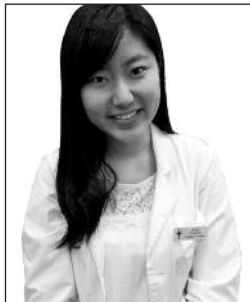

### **Diane Brideau-Laughlin, BSc (Pharm), MSc (HTA)**



Diane Brideau-Laughlin is currently Clinical Pharmacy Specialist, Palliative Care Services at The Moncton Hospital site of Horizon Health Network, New Brunswick. She also holds a position within the Oncology Pharmacy Services at The Moncton Hospital Outpatient Oncology Clinic.

Diane graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy with Honours from the College of Pharmacy, Dalhousie University, Halifax in 1978. Following her graduation, she spent a year in community practice and her hospital pharmacy practice in 1980 in Moncton, NB at the Georges L. Dumont Hospital where she held a position as staff pharmacist and clinical pharmacist in the Department of Veteran Affairs Unit. She joined The Moncton Hospital team in 1984 as a staff pharmacist. From 1995 to 2003 she held the position of Drug Information pharmacist and added the position of Drug Use Evaluation in 2003. In 2010 she became the Regional Lead for Health Technology Assessment for Horizon Health Network where she completed several research projects and HTA reports to help support an evidence-influenced approach to decision making.

During this period she completed a Masters in Science in HTA at l'Université de Montréal in 2014. Following this, she returned to clinical pharmacy practice.

Throughout her career, Diane has acted as a preceptor to pharmacy students in undergraduate and graduate programs, hospital pharmacy residency programs as well as being an educator to her peers, nurses, physicians and medical residents. She has held leadership positions within CSHP both at the Branch and National levels including Past-President of the NB Branch, Delegate to the CSHP Board, Chair or member of various national committees and task forces over the period spanning 1991 to 2015. Most recently she was a member of the CSHP 2015 Steering Committee, a reviewer for the CJHP and is currently member of the Hospital Pharmacy Practice Policy Statements Review Committee and the Practice Standards Steering Committee and is once again Branch President Elect. She has also held numerous other leadership positions including President of the Pharmacy Examination Board of Canada, President of the New Brunswick Pharmaceutical Society (currently the NB College of Pharmacists), President of the National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Associations and Chair of Health Canada's Expert Advisory Committee on the Vigilance of Health Products.

Diane is the recipient of the NB Pharmaceutical Society Meritorious Service Award and the CSHP-NB Branch Gordon Kane Meritorious Service Award.

Diane and her husband Tom are proud parents of three and grandparents of four.

## CSHP NEW FELLOWS NOUVEAUX ASSOCIÉS DE LA SCPH

### Dan Martinusen, BSc. (Pharm), ACPR, PharmD



Dr. Dan Martinusen is a practicing clinician in the Island Health Renal Program and a Clinical Instructor at the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Science at UBC. He also chairs the Pharmacy & Formulary Committee of the BC Provincial Renal Agency and has done so for 15 years. His practice interests relate to optimal use of medication at both the patient and population level. He has led projects including implementing an anemia management protocol in BC (savings to date \$55 million), implementing a first-in-Canada chronic disease electronic medication reconciliation program and involved in implementing a first-in-Canada glomerulonephritis formulary.

His current research includes both practice-related (de-prescribing, anemia, anticoagulation, thrombosis) as well as research into subsequent entry biologics.

Dan was pivotal in implementing the BC Anemia Protocol for patients with chronic kidney disease. The protocols are intended for use by all health professionals and have been in use for several years in BC. Recently, they have been adopted nationally by the Canadian Society of Nephrology. His initiatives have garnered the “leading practice” designation by Accreditation Canada both in medication reconciliation and in anemia management. Additionally he has led teams that have won three BC Patient Safety & Quality Awards, two Health Employers Association of BC awards and a national award from Canada Health Infoway.

Dan has been an active participant in the BC Branch as a past program chair, past branch president and member of the AGM host task force. He also chaired the CSHP BBS then Internet Committee in the early days of the web presence. He has been an active member of CSHP for more than 25 years and serves as a reviewer for the CJHP.

Dan completed his residency at Lions Gate Hospital in North Vancouver after completing his degree from UBC and subsequently completed his PharmD at the University of Washington.

He has precepted undergraduate students, hospital residents and PharmD students for 26 years and teaches in the 4th year nephrology course at the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at UBC.

He has given numerous presentations at provincial and national conferences and has recently served as an advisor on the role of the pharmacist to a US Congressional Committee.

### Sean P Spina, BScPharm, ACPR, PharmD



Dr. Sean Spina is Coordinator of Clinical Pharmacy Services at Royal Jubilee Hospital, Island Health (Victoria, BC). He is also a Clinical Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, University of British Columbia (UBC). Sean obtained his Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy degree from UBC, his accredited Hospital Pharmacy Residency diploma from Royal Columbian Hospital (New Westminster, BC), and his Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, UBC.

After completing his Pharmacy Practice Residency in 2001, Dr. Spina initiated his career as a clinical pharmacist in Internal Medicine at Royal Columbian Hospital. In 2007, he completed his PharmD and practiced as a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in Cardiac Surgery. In 2008, Sean moved to beautiful Vancouver Island and joined Island Health as the Coordinator of Clinical Pharmacy Services where he leads the Clinical Pharmacy Program.

Sean has been very active in CSHP at both the BC Branch and National levels. He has served as CSHP-BC Branch Communications Officer, CSHP-BC Branch Island-Chapter Chair, CSHP National Awards Committee member and National Membership Survey Committee. Sean has shared his knowledge, experience and passion for patient care by precepting over 40 students and providing over 90 invited provincial and national presentations. In 2012 Sean was recognized for his dedication to students and colleagues by being provided the CSHP BC Branch "Mentorship Award".

Dr. Spina advocates for the pharmacy profession by objectively capturing outcomes of pharmacy interventions. In 2012, he was awarded the Health Employers Association of British Columbia; Excellence in BC Health Care – Health Care Hero Award for advocating for the profession of pharmacy and the essential role pharmacists play on the care team. In 2014 his work with his Island Health team was awarded the CSHP National Management and Leadership Best Practice Award for "Improving Medication Safety through implementation of a Best Possible Medication History and Resolved Drug Therapy Problem Tracker Database". As a Council member with CSHP-BC Branch, Sean met with BC's Minister of Health to advocate for hospital pharmacists and highlight the positive health outcomes that patients experience when cared for by a pharmacist. Dr. Spina has been an active member of the Clinical Pharmacy Key Performance Indicator (cpKPI) national collaborative and is the vice-lead developing a national cpKPI electronic data capture system. Sean is passionate about incorporating technology into clinical practice and focuses his research efforts on formally evaluating the impact that smartphone technology has on clinician efficiency and patient care.
