


# Congratulations to Brian Tuttle, CSHP's New Honorary Member!

**Honorary Members** of CSHP are elected by not less than a two-thirds vote of CSHP Council after nomination in writing by 5 active members, in recognition of an outstanding contribution to the advancement of hospital pharmacy or a related field of health. Such membership is granted in perpetuity and is exempt from payment of fees.



**Brian Tuttle, B.Sc.(Pharm), M.Sc.Pharm, FCSHP**, retired in 2007 as Director of Pharmacy for the Capital District Health Authority in Nova Scotia. He began his pharmacy career in 1971 as Assistant Professor at the College of Pharmacy, Dalhousie University. He went on to institutional pharmacy practice at Camp Hill Hospital in 1975. For the next 26 years, Brian assumed various pharmacy management roles within Camp Hill and its successor institutions, specializing in drug information, and culminating in his appointment as Director of Pharmacy in 2001. He served on many university, hospital and government committees and task forces. He is a Past President of the Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists (CSHP) and its Nova Scotia Branch.

Over his career, Brian developed and implemented drug information services for Capital Health, a regional drug information referral service for pharmacists and health care professionals in the Maritime Provinces, a hospital-based drug evaluation unit supporting programs of the Nova Scotia Department of Health and a Regional Drug Adverse Reaction Reporting Program for Health Canada. He participated in the development of the region's first pharmacy residency program in 1972 and supervised pharmacy resident research projects for the next several years, becoming Residency Program Director in 2001. In 1972, Brian served as editor of a drug information newsletter circulated to all Maritime pharmacists; in 1978 he co-edited a drugs and therapeutics bulletin for Maritime physicians and pharmacists, with both publications together spanning a period of 31 years. He coordinated annual pharmacy management seminars for the Maritime region and was a long-time member and Chair of the Nova Scotia Drugs and Therapeutics Committee. He has authored many publications and been an invited speaker at many regional and national meetings and symposiums.

Brian is a recipient of many awards including the *Distinguished Service Award* from CSHP, the *Practitioner Award* from the NS Branch of CSHP, the *Bowel of Hygeia* and the *Meritorious Service Award* from the NS College of Pharmacists, and the *Alumnus Award* from the College of Pharmacy of Dalhousie University. He is a *Fellow* of CSHP. Each year, the *Brian Tuttle Award* recognizes the most outstanding pharmacy resident research project among the Dalhousie-affiliated pharmacy residency programs.

Brian received his undergraduate pharmacy training at Dalhousie University, completed his Hospital Pharmacy Residency at the Toronto General Hospital and received his Master of Science in Pharmacy from the University of Toronto. He lives with his wife Carolyn in Dartmouth, NS and has five children and six grandchildren.
